
Category A- Class I-II Category B- Class III-V Category C- Class VI-VIII Category D- Class IX-XII

The **Principal, Ms Rashmi Grover**, along with the entire staff appreciated the enthusiasm and readiness to switch over to the online mode and showcase their talent.






CALLIGRAPHY COMPETITION

"Our handwriting style depicts our personality traits".









ONLINE PARENT-TEACHER MEETING (A BROADER VISION)









LOCKDOWN ACTIVITY MASTI SE MASTISHK TAK
